Guided Studies in Current Economic Problems II
Course Outline

Course Description

ECON 4901 is divided into two parts. The first part contains two workshops that focus on research methodology and use of economic data. The second part involves lectures (conducted in English), classroom discussion, and presentation of research projects. With this format, students are expected not only to gain basic knowledge in the design of an appropriate research project but also to improve their public speaking and overall writing abilities.

Assessments

Part 1: STOT Workshops (20%)

- (i) To encourage students to attend the STOT workshops, attendance is counted as a part of the course assessment. A total of **4 marks** are assigned to the student’s attendance.
- (ii) To encourage students to better understand the materials covered in the STOT workshops, assignments are given and graded. A total of **16 marks** are allocated to the STOT-workshops assignments by the workshop instructor.

Course Requirements

Consultation

The consultation for research proposal in weeks 4 to 5 is compulsory. Each consultation session will last for 15 – 20 minutes and the schedules are to be posted at the Discussion Board in Blackboard system. Students are suggested to prepare a research proposal for discussion with the instructor. Other consultation sessions during weeks 6 to 10 are optional. Do come as long as you require one.

Presentation and Discussion

Each presentation will be no more than 20 minutes, followed by discussion and suggestion from audience. Each student will be assigned as discussant to a particular presentation.

Final Paper

The final paper should be between 12 and 20 pages in length (excluding tables, figures, and references). To ensure consistency in the format of the softcopy, the main text of the paper should comply with the following format, Font: Times New Roman, Font size: 12 point, Margin: 1 inch all around, Spacing: 0pt before, 0pt after, double line spacing.

The deadline for the final paper is 5pm on **12 December 2024 (Thursday)**. Students are required to submit a softcopy (via VeriGuide as well) and a hardcopy of their papers with the VeriGuide statement signed (via the assignment box of 9th floor ELB) to the instructor. Late submission will receive a zero mark.
